

FY22 Highlights

Significant Accomplishments/Changes:

This FY brought new changes to the AHIMT Program. With the implementation of the National Three-Tiered System, the 17 IMTs within Texas were determined to be IMT-L (local teams). TDEM shifted our focus on establishing the IMT-R (state/regional teams) based on the 6 TDEM Regions.

- State/Regional Team Application established (about 260 applications received by June 2022).
- Program SOGs revised and executed, including the revision of the Qualification Guide.
- Advertised the new AHIMT Program at the TDEM Emergency Management Conference.
- TDEM developed their TEMAT MOU to house “all” System Response Programs in one contract.
 - o 220 MOUs distributed within the AHIMT Program, 62 awaiting TDEM signatures for completion.
 - o Reimbursement to Local Jurisdictions will be handled by TDEM.
 - o TAMFS involvement with contracts and reimbursements, once TEMAT MOU is fully executed, will be minimal.
- New Program Logo developed.
 - o First round of uniform shirts ordered.
 - o Uniform site established, ready to implement in FY23 with grant funding.

The HRP & Qualifications Committee added an AHIMT presence to start reviewing Program Taskbooks for credentialing.

IMT members deployed for over 200 days to wildfire support, COVID, and All-Hazard events.

TEEX requested our help in coordinating/delivering an Incident Commander course to the Los Alamos National Laboratory in New Mexico. Successfully completed April 11 – 15, 2022 with glowing reviews.

Assisted TDEM with the coordination and delivery of two Liaison Officer courses and approved the internal delivery of a Staging Area Manager course.
